

**Minutes of Little Bealings Parish Council meeting held at Bealings Village Hall at 7.30pm

**1 Apologies and Declarations of Interest.**

Apologies were received from Dr C Rowe. Mrs Wilson declared a prejudicial pecuniary interest in East Anglia ONE Offshore Windfarm, having a beneficial interest in land in the parish affected by the route

**2 Planning**

**East Anglia ONE Offshore Windfarm: Post-Submission Report and Supplementary Environmental Information**

Mrs Wilson left the meeting in accordance with her declaration of a prejudicial pecuniary interest in this item.

Mr Fryatt reported that the public meeting held by the applicants on 6 June had explained that Playford had been chosen as a CSS due to its location on the cable route. The volume of traffic and proposed traffic routes had also been discussed, as had the reason for amending the HDD proposal for Lodge Road. It was noted that no traffic was proposed to travel through Lt Bealings, although the haul road which crossed both Holly Lane and Lodge Road would be used for traffic. It was **RESOLVED**:

- that the extra information and the change in respect of the HDD proposal for Lodge Road made no difference to the Council's objection to the routing of the cable through Bealings and its preference for AOA (the northern route) for the cable.
- that the applicants should be requested to carry out assessment of:
  - the impact of use of the haul road by construction traffic on current vehicular use of Holly Lane and Lodge Road
  - noise, vibration and air quality impacts on Holly Lane and Lodge Road, the current assessment of impact on The Street being irrelevant given the location of the cable route and haul road.
- that SCDC and SCC should be asked to produce a Local Impact Report for Bealings, as referred to by the Planning Inspectorate.

There being no further business to discuss the meeting closed at 8.05pm.
